DAVID RAYMOND TAGGART, D. D.

D. R. Taggart, whose biographical sketch appears in Thompson's **Sketches of the Ministers,** was in 1930, the year of that book's publication, pastor of our Topeka, Kansas congregation. He had been installed there on February 12, 1918, and continued to serve in this capacity until 1938. "In 1933 he was elected by Synod as an editor of 'The Covenanter Witness': in 1938 he assumed full responsibility for it. Nine times he was elected for a three year term in this wider ministry of the Church. He was faithfully aided in all these services by his wife and daughters."

He was elected Moderator of our Synod in 1953. In 1954 Geneva College conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Divinity.

The excellent memoir prepared by M. W. Dougherty furnishes further information about this humble, devoted servant of his Lord: "His name is listed in Who's Who of the Clergy. He was a member of the Eugene Field Society of Authors and of the Kansas Authors Club. He was the author of the book: **The Faith of Abraham Lincoln**.

"We do not undertake to erect a huge monument to his memory, for his work continues on. He loved the Church and served with patience and faithfulness. On November 12, 1958, he was transferred into the presence of his Master, the Author and Finisher of life. Time ceased for him, but life continues on. We who remain bow in submission and reverence to an all-wise God."
